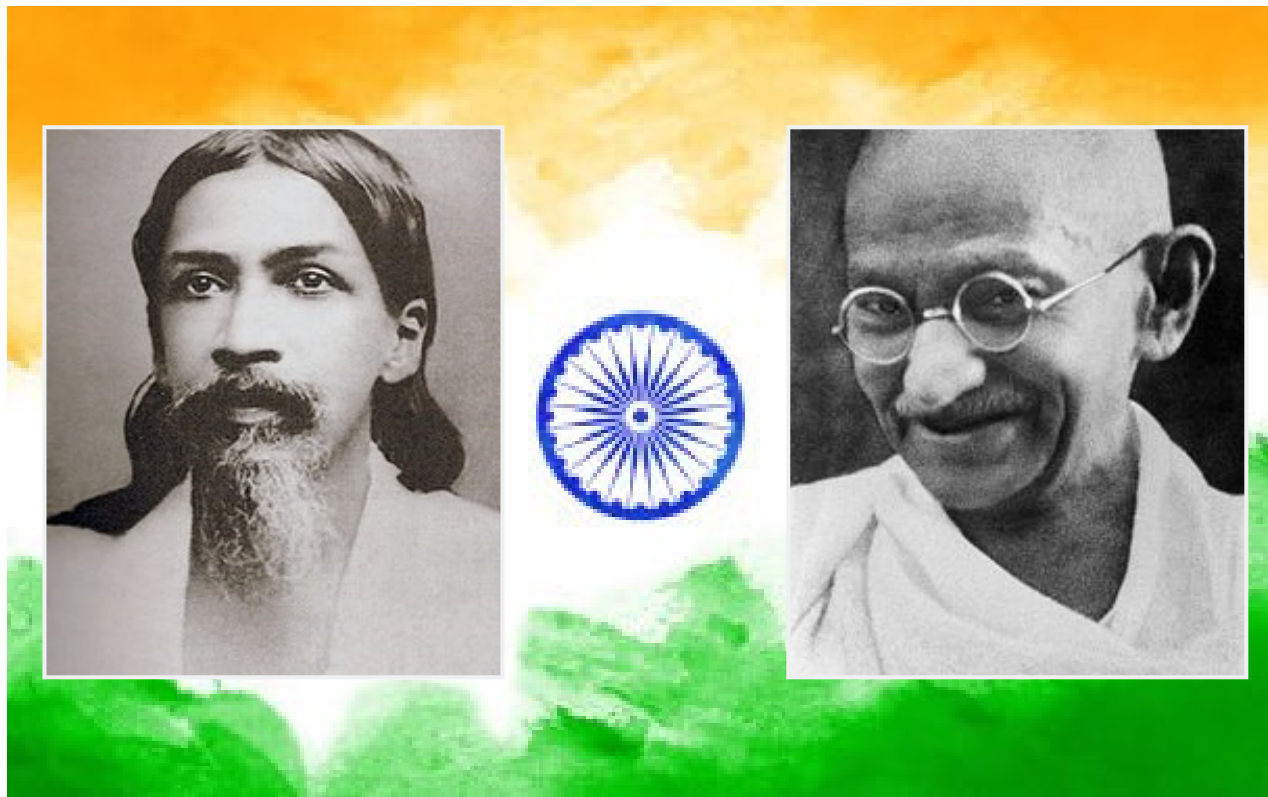

Mahatma Gandhi is the key figure westerners are aware of in terms of India's independence movement. To Indians, he was one of a host of leaders and cherished figures known as "freedom fighters." For instance, Aurobindo Ghose was a central leader a decade before Gandhi who advocated for the use of violence in certain circumstances.
